Activity Suggestions! Road Safety is no accident...



- 1) Play a quick game of Stop, Look, Listen and Think. Have children practise each of the gestures when you call out each word. Try mixing the words up to encourage children to recall the action.
- 2) Display traffic signs around the yard. Move around the yard with the children reading and doing what the sign says.
- 3) Get the children to make traffic lights and then use them outside on the bike track to direct traffic.

- 4) Create a crosswalk on the bike track and encourage children to use this to move over the bike track as they play.
- 5) Road safety flash cards at a mat session.
- 6) Encourage children to play with toy vehicles and toy passengers (i.e. teddy or doll).
- 7) Give children a selection of materials to make a restraint for their toy. Talk about what happens to their toy with and without the restraint.

- 8) Car building - Suggest children make a car large enough for them to sit in and go for a ride. This can be done using chairs, cardboard boxes, crates or other materials available. Help younger children to build their car. Talk about restraints and suggest children make these using stockings, scarves, strips of fabric or other materials that can be tied across the child. Tell me what's in your car to keep you safe. Give children time to play 'going for a ride' in their car, making sure they put on their restraint.
